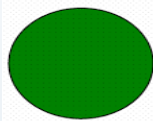

The International HPH Network Task Force on Health Promotion for and with Children and Adolescents (TF HPH-CA) has defined Standards and Indicators on health promotion for children and adolescents in Hospitals and Health care services. The goal was to provide a specific contribution to give voice to children's and adolescents' health promotion needs in hospital and healthcare services, as children and adolescents present with specific features and requests. The Standards and Indicators took inspiration from the concepts, guidelines and outcomes of the WHO Standards for Health Promotion in Hospital (2004) and from the Child Rights-based Approach developed by the UN Agencies



International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals & Health Services

The WHO Standards for Health Promotion in Hospitals (Management policy, Patient assessment, Patient information, Healthy workplace, Continuity and cooperation) have been adapted to children's and adolescents' specific needs.

The Task Force has tested the tool in five Children's Hospitals in Estonia, Hungary, Italy, Spain, USA and is currently working on modalities and a timeframe for the dissemination of the tool at International level, also in collaboration with the International HPH Network, with the Italian HPH Network and with the Trentino HPH Network.
